Crokinole championship keeps growing

In eight years of play, attending every World Crokinole Championship in Tavistock since 1999, the Beierling brothers have always gone home with an award. This year, however, Jason Beierling took home the top prize as the adult singles World Champion of Crokinole. He defeated Brian Cook of Toronto in the final round to take the coveted title, a wooden trophy and \$1,000 cash.

Jason and his brother, Raymond, placed first in the doubles division in both 1999 and 2000 while finishing third in 2003, second on 2004, and third in 2005. Jason was second in the 2002 competition behind triple-winner Joe Fulop, who failed to make the top four this year. Raymond was third in the singles category in 2003.

A total of 519 people participated in this year's event on Saturday, June 3, 2006, another record attendance, up over fifty competitors from last year. Players returned from Prince Edward Island, Pennsylvania, Texas, Massachusetts and Michigan, while other former champions also came back to defend their titles.

As mentioned, three-time winner Joe Fulop of Exeter, who is battling Parkinson's Disease, made it into the top sixteen, but was unable to advance to the final

four. Last year's winner, Bruce Hartung, 2003 champion Raymond Kappes, and 2000 winner Al Fuhr were all in attendance. Brian Cook of Toronto has finished in second place three years in a row now - 2004, 2005, and 2006 - but was able to take home the trophy for the most 20's (79) scored in the preliminary round.

Teskey Baldwin of Plattsville successfully defended his junior title winning the second year in a row. Only five competitors participated in the junior division with Nathan Tollenaar second and Evan Tollenaar third, both from Monkton, and Trevor Grasby of Stratford fourth. Honourable mention went to the youngest player in this year's tournament, Kohl Hedley of Beachburg, Ontario.

The father and son duo of Doug and Nyle Eby also defended their cue doubles championship title for the second year. Alvin Wagler and Floyd Kipfer of Milverton placed second while third place went to Waldron Eckstein and Marlin Good, New Hamburg, and fourth place to Harvey Benneweiss (the tournament's oldest competitor) and Ivan Coward, both of Kitchener.

Returnees Ron and Ray Haymes of Wainfleet, another father and son team, earned the doubles championship over former champions Richard and Robert Mader. The Haymes duo placed 8th last year. Perennial top place finishers John Conrad and Paul Hartman were third, while Julie Neeb and Tony Snyder placed fourth. A record 115 doubles teams competed in this year's event.

In the recreational division, Robert Bonnett of Kincardine earned the trophy defeating Jeremy Walsh of St. Pauls. Jeffrey Roth of Kitchener was third and Glenn Runyon of Honey Brook, Pennsylvania was fourth.

In the intermediate division, Nathan Walsh of St. Pauls was declared the winner over Will Taylor of Millbrook. Will also

placed second last year and second in 2003 and 2004 in the junior division. Cara Elliott of Komoka was third in the intermediate division and Jesse Wiseman of Kitchener was fourth.

Two of Tavistock's dedicated crokinole players earned prizes in the cue singles category. Raymond Schwartzentruber captured the cue singles title defeating Stephen Cage of Kitchener while Wayne Schultz of Tavistock came in third over fourth place Carl Litt of Kitchener.

Brand new boards manufactured by Willard Martin of Elmira were on sale and Mr. Martin was there to meet with prospective buyers. The new boards feature a beautifully finished playing surface and deep burgundy markings and the official World Crokinole insignia. 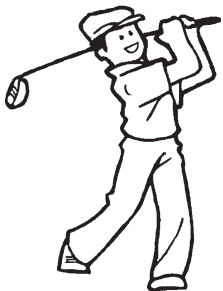
